What words should we understand and be able to use?

Kingdom of God	For Christians, the Kingdom of God is wherever God is the ruler of human lives. Whoever calls God their King and follows God's way is part of this Kingdom. Jesus invites everyone to enter the Kingdom of God by allowing God to rule their lives.
Acts	Acts is a book in the New Testament of the Bible which describes what happened in the early days after Jesus' resurrection.
Trinity	The Trinity is the Christian belief that God is the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; three in one.
Holy Spirit	The Holy Spirit is one part of the Trinity and is known as a helper, comforter and guide in the lives of the early Christians and in Christians today. The Holy Spirit is God's gift to people to help them know and love him better.
Pentecost	Pentecost is a celebration for Christians. It is known as the Church's birthday, where the Holy Spirit guided the early disciples to preach about Jesus' teachings to all nations.
Salvation	Salvation means that Jesus died to save the human race. Christians remember Jesus' death on Good Friday. Jesus died and was raised to life to bring in a new 'Kingdom' where God rules in people's lives.
